Children and families are invited to participate in this fun arts day at Pinecrest Gardens.

(Miami – October 14, 2016) – The Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and Pinecrest Gardens are hosting [Arts for Wellness Day](#) on Saturday, November 5, 2016 featuring a variety of interactive expressive arts and healing activities for children and families with and without disabilities, in an inclusive and supportive setting. The event includes a community resource fair highlighting the Arts for Wellness theme.

WHO: Presented by the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs through its “All Kids Included - Accessible Arts Experiences for Kids” (AKI) program, and Pinecrest Gardens

WHAT: [Arts for Wellness Day](#) – A day to explore the intersection of wellness, creativity and the imagination. Families can participate in a variety of interactive expressive arts programs and healing modalities, including art, music, movement, guided mediation, light therapy, vocal toning, gardening and yoga.

All Arts for Wellness Day activities are free with a \$5 general admission fee to the garden.
