Subject: FY 2014-15 Summer Arts & Science Camps for Kids (SAS-C)

Grants Program Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 31 grants for a total of \$450,000 from the FY 2014-2015 Summer Arts & Science Camps for Kids (SAS-C) Grants Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2014-2015 Summer Arts & Science Camps for Kids (SAS-C) Grants Panel, chaired by Councilor Monty Trainer, convened on Thursday, January 8, 2015 to review 31 applications requesting a total of \$783,840. The Panel recommended funding all 31 applications for a total of \$450,000. The Summer Arts & Science Camps for Kids (SAS-C) Grants Program was created as a joint initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and The Children's Trust. The objective of the SAS-C Program is to grant funding to non-profit organizations that will provide underserved children in Miami-Dade County with opportunities to attend high quality cultural arts or science summer camp programs at little or no cost. Funding through the SAS-C Grants Program is intended to augment existing programs, providing more children with the opportunity to participate in cultural arts and science summer camps. Applicants to this program must have a minimum one-year track record of providing high quality, arts or science summer camp programs for children and/or youth in Miami-Dade County.

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact, 2) artistic/scientific merit, 3) management capability, and 4) reach/priority considerations.

Priority attention for evaluating applications was given to:

- projects that addressed children whose ability to participate in such programs may be limited by geography, economics or disability; and
- projects in which unduplicated children underwritten by SAS-C funding will attend the camp program for four weeks or more.

Attached is a list describing the projects recommended for funding.

Funding for the Summer Arts & Science Camps for Kids Grants Program is derived from funds granted to the Department from The Children's Trust (\$450,000). All grant award recommendations are contingent upon approval by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor, and are subject to the availability of funds.
