Subject: FY 2015-2016 Youth Arts Enrichment Program Grant Award Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 33 grants for a total of \$450,000.00 from the FY 2015-2016 Youth Arts Enrichment Program.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Cultural Affairs FY 2015-2016 Youth Arts Enrichment Program (YEP) convened on July 9, 2015 to review 40 applications requesting a total of \$583,120.00. The YEP Grants Panel was chaired by Cultural Affairs Council member Alejandro Aguirre and Councilor Mireille Chancy-Gonzalez also served on the panel. The Panel recommended funding 33 applications for a total of \$450,000.00. Seven (7) applications scored below the threshold established by the Panel and were not recommended for funding.

The Youth Arts Enrichment Program was created as a joint initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and The Children's Trust. The objective of the YEP Grants Program is to enrich the lives of children through the arts by making the arts available to more children and families throughout Miami-Dade County, whereby children will have opportunities to have positive live arts experiences through:

- Arts Instruction
- Arts Intervention
- Healing/Expressive Arts
- In-school Performances
- Public Performances/Exhibitions

Applicants to this program must have a minimum two-year track record of providing high quality, cultural arts programs for children and/or youth. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

The Youth Arts Enrichment Program (YEP) is structured into two funding categories:

CATEGORY A: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts, such as sequential arts instruction, after-school arts programs, in-school arts residency programs, etc. These projects must be able to measure the impact of repeated participation in these programs on the students over the project period. **Applicants in Category A may request up to \$25,000**.

CATEGORY B: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for arts enrichment experiences for children and youth. **Applicants in Category B may request up to \$10,000.**

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact, 2) artistic merit, 3) management and financial capability, and 4) reach, giving priority attention to: projects that addressed children whose ability to participate in such programs may be limited by geography, economics or disability; and projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts.

Attached is a list describing the projects recommended for funding.

Funding for the Youth Arts Enrichment Program is derived from funding granted to the Department from The Children's Trust (\$450,000.00). All funding recommendations are contingent upon approval of the Department of Cultural Affairs' FY 2015-2016 budget by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor, and are subject to the availability of funds.

FY 2015-2016 Grant Award Recommendations

1. Alhambra Music, Inc.

Recommended Award: \$10,000

Grant funds will be used to support 7-9 school visits, an in-school concert, a concerto competition with concert, and scholarships to a chamber workshop. Over 800 students, ages 6-18, will be reached from October 2015 to May 2016 at schools and venues throughout the county. Activities include interactive listening and discussion, with performance and coaching for music students. Participants will engage in group sessions and guided listening; they will learn about music and its role in our lives.

2. Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support Arts Ballet Goes to School for students, ages 6 to 17, from October 1, 2015 to May 30, 2016 at 11 public schools in Miami-Dade. Project activities will include ballet and music lectures and performances. Participants will engage in ballet and music activities and benefit from learning to understand ballet and become future young audiences in our county.

Grant funds will be used to support Arts Beyond the Classroom (ABC) for 400 students, ages 4-17, October 1, 2015 - May 31, 2016 at ArtSouth in the City of South Miami. Project activities will include transforming youth through singing, dancing, painting and drawing. Participants will engage in 2-D and 3-D multimedia art, musical expression, playing simple musical instruments, modern dance, classical dance and service learning experiences and benefit from lasting training in art and performance.

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4. Bakehouse Art Complex, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support the expansion of the Bakehouse Art Complex (BAC) In-School Artist Residency Program for 450 students, ages 8-15, during the 2015-16 school year at three public schools: Jose de Diego Middle, Santa Clara Elementary, and Ada Merritt K-8, all in Wynwood/downtown Miami. Project activities will include visual arts instruction in various media taught by BAC resident artists. Expansion includes more participants per school who will benefit from direct exposure to career artists.

Short Cuts, an in-school touring program which goes into Miami-Dade County public schools, is an interactive and adaptive series offering the transformative power of live theatre to empower children with tools learned from original short plays comprising anti-bullying and self-respect messages for youth to overcome obstacles.

Twice weekly, activities will include musical instrument lessons, music theory classes, and performance ensembles that develop creative ability. Beyond theoretical and practical learning, the project will build improvisational skills that instill greater imagination and self-expression.

Grant funds will be used to support "BULLYING - PART TWO" writing and illustrating workshops for 70 youth, ages 11-18, October 1, 2015-May 30, 2016 at North Miami Senior High School. Students will learn about the perspective of victims, bullies and observers as well as use writing and art illustration to clarify feelings, improve communication skills, and expand creativity and foster understanding.

8. Delou Africa, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support Delou's Youth Arts Initiative for 150 students, ages 5-18, from October 1, 2015-May 31, 2016 at Liberty City Elementary School, Little Haiti Cultural Center, and Overtown Youth Center. Project activities include workshops, classes and student showcases. Participants will engage in sequenced instruction in African dance, African drumming, and traditional craft-making. Participants will benefit from increased art skills and greater appreciation of cultural arts.

9. Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden, Inc.

Grant funds will be used to support Arts Integration at Fairchild and will engage 1,900 students, ages 5-18, from October 1, 2015-May 30, 2016 at Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden in Coral Gables. Project activities will include visual arts workshops led by local artists, student art show, performance showcase, documentary writing/production and award ceremonies to recognize and showcase program winners. Participants will engage in visual and performing arts and benefit from small group instruction, arts training, and public presentation.

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10. Florida Grand Opera, Inc.

Project activities will include in-class workshops featuring elements of opera production including lighting, costumes, set and prop design, the science of singing, and the history of opera. Participants will engage in opera and benefit from arts integrated common core curriculum, literacy, and career development and exploration.

The focus will be on the new weekly musical theater circle, in partnership with Miami Children's Theater. Other YEP-funded activities include weekly guitar circle and twice monthly music therapy. Children benefit from arts exposure by increasing their communication skills, attention spans, and interpersonal and emotional responses.

Project activities will include in-class workshops, an abridged performance, post-show discussion, and a study guide that includes classroom activities and historical background. Participants will engage in theatre and benefit from hands-on experience with Shakespeare's language and live performance.

The one hour per week, twenty week dance program, will culminate in a final performance at the Miami Senior High School Auditorium. Participants will gain social, physical, emotional and learning skills through the discipline of dance training and preparation for the final performance.

Project activities will include exploring and learning about 165 acres of preserved beachfront ecosystems and creating nature-themed art with a local artist. Students will benefit from being outdoors, engaging all their senses, and learning to design, draw, and paint their surroundings.
