Subject: FY 2023-2024 Youth Arts Enrichment Program Grant Award Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 33 grants for a total of \$550,000.00 from the FY 2023-2024 Youth Arts Enrichment Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2023-2024 Youth Arts Enrichment Program (YEP) Grants Panel, chaired by Mireille Chancy-Gonzalez, convened on September 7, 2023 to review 35 applications requesting a total of \$701,150.00. The Panel recommended funding 33 applications for a total of \$550,000.00. Two (2) applications scored below the threshold established by the Panel and were not recommended for funding.

YEP was created as a joint initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and The Children's Trust. The objective of the YEP Grants Program is to enrich the lives of children through the arts by making the arts available to more children and families throughout Miami-Dade County, whereby children will have opportunities to have positive live arts experiences through:

- Arts Instruction
- Arts Intervention
- Healing/Expressive Arts
- In-school Arts Residencies and Performances
- Out-of-School/Public Arts Exhibitions and Performances

Applicants to this program must have a minimum one-year track record of providing high quality, cultural arts programs for children and/or youth. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

YEP is structured into three funding categories:

CATEGORY A: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts, such as sequential arts instruction, after-school arts programs, in-school arts residency programs, etc. These projects must be able to measure the impact of repeated participation in these programs on the students over the project period. **Applicants in Category A may request up to \$30,000.**

CATEGORY B: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for arts enrichment experiences for children and youth. **Applicants in Category B may request \$10,000.**

CATEGORY C: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that serve children, youth and young adults with disabilities through inclusive arts and cultural programs so that kids of all abilities and their families can participate fully in the arts. **Applicants in Category C may request up to \$20,000.**

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact, 2) artistic merit, 3) management and financial capability, and 4) reach, giving priority attention to: projects that address children whose ability to participate in such programs may be limited by geography, economics or disability; and projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts.

Attached is a list describing the projects recommended for funding.

Funding for the YEP program is derived from the FY 2023-2024 grant awarded to the Department by The Children's Trust. All funding recommendations are contingent upon approval of the Department of Cultural Affairs' FY 2023-2024 budget by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor and are subject to the availability of funds.

Arts Ballet Goes to Ojus Elementary

Grant funds will be used to support the sixth year of *Arts Ballet Goes to Ojus Elementary School*, a 22-week residency program for 30 students, ages PreK through 5th grade, at Ojus Elementary School. The program includes an introduction to ballet appreciation, and participants will learn the basics of ballet and other dance styles, theory of dance, ballet vocabulary, and the Russian ballet style.

Arts Beyond the Classroom (ABC)

Grant funds will be used to support *Arts Beyond the Classroom* for 120 students, ages 6-15, taking place October 16, 2023 - May 17, 2024 at Sweet Home Academy in Perrine, The Young Men's Preparatory Academy in Miami and Chapman Partnership in Homestead. Project activities will include dancing, singing, playing musical instruments, painting and drawing. Participants will engage in visual arts, music and dance and benefit from participating in the public demonstration of their work.

Music, Kids & Wellness

Grant funds will be used to support *Music, Kids & Wellness* for 700 students/patients, ages 0 to 21, from October 2023 through May 2024 at the Miami Learning Experiences School, UM Bascom Palmer Eye Institute - Pediatric Department and Holtz Children's Hospital in Miami-Dade County. Participants will learn movement and rhythm in song with the use of various percussion instruments. The songs featured in the program will range from Brazilian Bossa nova, Disney classics and American popular tunes.

The Inheritants Project

Grant funds will be used to support *The Inheritants Project* for 618 students, ages 0-18, beginning October 28, 2023 and concluding on April 15, 2024. The project will take place at The Doral Yard, The Koubeck Center and The Barnyard. Project activities will include craft building, interactive dance and a mini concert. Youth will learn about ancestral customs practiced in Miami neighborhoods, such as crafting sugar "offrendas", creating Sekeres-beaded gourds, learning social folkloric dance, which will enhance their overall music awareness.

CAP Miami Jazz Institute Creativity for All

Grant funds will be used to support the *CAP Miami Jazz Institute Creativity for All* for 100 students, ages 10-18, from across Miami-Dade County. The program will take place October 2, 2023 through May 27, 2024 at Coral Gables Congregational Church. Project activities will include twice-weekly harmony classes, instrument coaching, and jam sessions. Participants will explore unique musical ideas and benefit from skills that create freedom of expression and build well-rounded musicians for today's varied performance demands.

Centro Mater Arts Education Project

Grant funds will be used to support the *Centro Mater Arts Education Project* program for 70 students, ages 6 to 12 years. The program will take place at the Centro Mater East Center in Little Havana and run from October 9, 2023 through May 17, 2024. Project activities will include theater, movement, music, and drawing. Participants will engage in instruction in painting, singing, dancing, acting, musical therapy, and makeup. Participants will apply the skills learned in the program in a full bilingual theater production.

Arts Evolve Academy

Grant funds will support the *Arts Evolve Academy* after school program for 50 students, ages 7-17, at Dr. Michael M. Krop Sr. High and Norland Middle in North Miami from October 7, 2023 through May 4, 2024. Participants will engage in musical theater and symphonic band instruction. Activities include weekly instruction in dance, acting, musical theater, and symphonic music. Students will also enjoy two specialty workshops, attend one professional concert and participate in one live, theatrical performance.

Project activities will include performances, talkbacks with actors, and study guides. Participants will engage in theatre and benefit from experiencing a live production, meeting and learning from theatre professionals, and hands-on experience of the curriculum through the works of William Shakespeare.

Benefits for participants of the program include helping reduce pain while decreasing symptoms of stress, stimulating mental function and developing social/emotional bonds due to isolation.

Participants will learn about black fiddle players in the American South, further informing them about this segment of US history and the evolution of that music.

Grant funds will be used to support *Connecting Youth With Nature Through Art*, an afterschool program for 50 students, ages 6-18, taking place October 1, 2023 - May 31, 2024 at the Henry K Mack K-8 in West Littler River. The program includes instruction in the classroom and outdoor field trips. Project activities include arts, music, drama, fishing, swimming, hiking, life skills and STEAM. The art will include visual arts, drawing, painting, sculpture, and printmaking. They will also learn about art history and develop their artistic skills.
