All Kids Included (AKI) – Accessible Arts Experiences for Kids promotes inclusive arts and cultural programs in school settings and throughout the community so that kids of all abilities and their families can participate fully in the arts.

Youth Arts in Parks – Have fun, make friends and get creative in this inclusive arts program in a social setting, featuring weekly classes in visual arts, dance, animation and more.

Animation Gets Real Miami – A summer camp in animation and film-making for teens and young adults on the autism spectrum.

Zot Artz – A unique painting adventure for kids of all abilities, using tools created by acclaimed artist and inventor Dwayne Szot.

Sensory-Friendly Programs – Kids can enjoy a theater, music or museum experience in an accepting and inclusive environment.

Arts for Wellness Day – Explore creativity and imagination through expressive arts and healing modalities that include yoga, guided meditation and nature activities.

AKI Family Arts Festival – Free festival day filled with interactive arts activities, live performances, giveaways, and community resources for parents.
