#### ITEMS FOR RATIFICATION

#### FY 2021-2022 Grants Program Guidelines

Mr. Spring reported there are no substantive changes to the guidelines for the Capital Development (CAP), Cultural Advancement (ADV), Cultural Development (CDG), Dance Miami Choreographers' (DMC), Developing Arts and in Neighborhoods, Festivals and Special Events (FEST), Hannibal Cox, Jr. (HCJ), International Cultural Partnerships (ICP), Major Cultural Institutions (MCI), Youth Arts Enrichment (YEP), and Youth Arts Miami (YAM) grants programs. The guidelines provide the Department of Cultural Affairs the flexibility to authorize that programs presented by cultural organizations can occur in a virtual format and provide extensions as needed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. # FY 2020-2021 Community Grants (CG) Grants Third Quarter Program Panel Recommendations

Mr. Spring reported that the FY 2020-2021 Community Grants Program Panel, chaired by Councilor Sigars-Malina, met on February 11, 2021. A total of 19 organizations submitted applications to the program, requesting a total of \$159,250 in support funds. The panel reviewed and recommended funding all 19 applications for \$129,375. The Community Grants program is responsive on a quarterly basis to organizations which develop small and large-scale community-based programs, projects, events and publications.

# FY 2020-2021 Summer Arts and Science Camps for Kids (SAS-C) Grants Program Panel Recommendations

Mr. Spring reported that the FY 2020-2021 Summer Arts and Science Camps for Kids Program Panel, chaired by Councilor Monty Trainer, convened on February 25, 2021 to review 48 applications requesting \$1,734,390 in cultural funding. The Panel recommended funding all 48 applications for a total of \$825,000. The program is designed to help provide underserved children with opportunities to attend high quality cultural arts or science summer camp programs at little or no cost.
