- **Shows/Performances: Afterschool and Winter Arts Demonstrations**



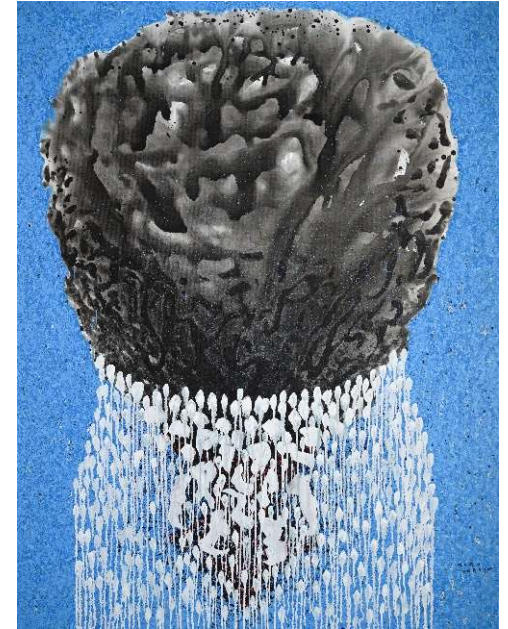
