One of the first public art programs in the country, Miami-Dade Art in Public Places was established in 1973 with the passage of an ordinance allocating 1.5% of the capital cost of new county buildings for the purchase or commission of artworks. Art in Public Places is overseen by a citizens' Trust and the vital work of Art in Public Places would not be possible been done without the commitment and dedication of the Trust.

Appointed by the Board of County Commissioners, the Trustees act in the public interest to ensure quality selection, maintenance, planning, public education, and curating of all works of art acquired by the program. Their tireless effort and commitment have resulted in more than 1,000 works of art in the public catalogue and gained international recognition as a leader in its field.

Creative problem-solving through innovative collaborations with artist, architects, historians, and engineers has resulted in projects that validate, define, and expand the beauty of Miami-Dade County. Public art can be accessed in Miami International Airport, Metrorail and Metromover stations, PortMiami, Zoo Miami, Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts, parks, fire stations, libraries, police stations, public housing developments, courthouses, and community health centers.

Detailed Description

The Gallery at West Brickell is a new construction mixed-income, mixed-use buildings within the City of Miami. The facility is comprised of two individual buildings connected by a bridge. The development will have 465 units in 29 stories and will include a stand-alone parking garage with 547-parking spaces. Amenities include work from home offices, podcast flex room, conference room, co-work space, package room, fitness center, yoga/spinning room, game room, media room, clubhouse, dining room, and a rooftop pool with barbecues, as well as a flex lawn. The estimated completion of the garage is May of 2024. The second part of construction will be completed at a later date, estimated for the last quarter of 2025.
