FY 2020-2021 Community Grants (CG) Program Panel Recommendations – Fourth Quarter

Mr. Spring reported that the FY 2020-2021 Community Grants Program Panel, chaired by Councilor Sigars-Malina, met on April 28, 2021. A total of 20 organizations submitted applications to the program, requesting a total of \$147,500 in support funds. The panel reviewed and recommended funding all 20 applications for \$139,000. The Community Grants program is responsive on a quarterly basis to organizations which develop small and large-scale community-based programs, projects, events and publications. FY 2021-2022 Community Grants (CG) Program Guidelines

Mr. Spring reported there are no substantive changes to the guidelines for the Community Grants (CG) program. The guidelines provide the Department of Cultural Affairs the flexibility to authorize those programs presented by cultural organizations in a virtual format and provide extensions as needed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. They were approved unanimously. (Motion by Ms. Sugrañes; seconded by Mr. Bierman)

FY 2021-2022 Capital Development (CAP) Grants Program Panel

Mr. Spring presented the grant panel list for the Capital Development (CAP) grants program. It was approved unanimously. (Motion by Ms. Rees; seconded by Mr. Plasencia)

FY 2020-2021 Festivals and Specials Events (FEST) Grant Program Panel Recommendations

Mr. Spring reported that the FY 2021-2022 Festivals and Special Events Grant Program Panel, chaired by Councilor Rosa Sugrañes, convened on May 6, 2021, to review 15 applications requesting \$1,235,000 in cultural funding. The Panel recommended funding all 15 applications based on the program formula. The program is designed to support festivals presented by legally incorporated 501(c)(3) nonprofit Florida corporations and/or units of local government. The following Council member declared a conflict of interest and abstained from voting on the following:

Mitchell Bierman - Florida International University Board of Trustees, for the benefit of the School of Hospitality – South Beach Wine and Food Festival

A motion was made to fund all the of the panel's recommendations subject to Councilors with conflicts abstaining from voting on the applications affected. The Councilor with the above-mentioned conflict of interest abstained from the voting. They were approved unanimously. (Motion by Ms. Sugrañes; seconded by Mr. Trieger)

FY 2020-2021 Hannibal Cox, Jr. (HCJ) Grants Program Panel Recommendations

Mr. Spring reported that the FY 2021-2022 Hannibal Cox, Jr. (HCJ) Program Panel, chaired by Councilor Monty Trainer, convened on April 27, 2021, to review 23 applications requesting \$690,000 in cultural funding. The Panel recommended funding all 23 applications based on the grant formula. The program is designed to provide funding and technical assistance to mid-sized semi-professional and professional organizations with a year-round season of cultural activities. Director's Report

- Mr. Spring reported that the City of Miami filed a brief appealing the Coconut Grove Playhouse Project case.
- The Westchester Cultural Arts Center is close to completion. Mayor Levine Cava and Commissioner Souto will announce plans for the "East Park" outdoor amphitheater adjacent to the project. The amphitheater is expected to be finalized by fall of 2022.
- Roxy Theatre Group has been matched to manage the Westchester Cultural Arts Center. Miami-Dade Parks will manage the outdoor park.
- The County is currently working to authorize the use of \$10 million in GOB funds for the expansion of The Wolfsonian-FIU. The museum must work to develop the plans and raise additional funding needed for the project.

Councilor Reports

- Ms. Sigars-Malina reported that the Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden has a family-friendly Jurassic Garden dinosaur exhibit open through the summer.
- Mr. Henriques noted that the cultural community is seeking guidance on how to reopen post-COVID-19 pandemic and is pleased to see the Department is taking an active role.
- Mr. Bierman recognized the passing of Terrence Riley, who was the director of the Miami Art Museum, now known as the Pérez Art Museum Miami, at a critical moment.
- Mr. Plasencia reported that he attended the Arsht Center's 15th year gala. He also added that a portion of SW 8th Street has been named after Rosa Maria Plasencia, his cousin and founder of the non-profit Amigos for Kids.
- Mr. Trieger noted that the Make Music Miami event will take place on June 21, 2021.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:31 AM.
