 FY 2021-22 Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Program Recommendations

In light of the uncertainty surrounding the long-term impact of Covid-19 on public programs scheduled to begin after October 1, 2021, staff advised the Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grant Program Panel at the panel's orientation to review and score each proposal based upon both the quality of the application and the ability to satisfactorily address each of the evaluation criteria, as stated in the program's guidelines. The award recommendations will be computed using the established funding formulas for this program. The program's FY 2021-2022 total allocation and the recommended grant award amounts per grantee will be presented to the Council for final review later this summer, after all the Spring cycle grants program panels have convened and preliminary FY 2021-2022 budget numbers are received.

MIAMIDADE

Final grant awards are contingent upon the availability of funds in the Department's FY 2021-2022 budget, which is subject to the County's Budget as adopted in September 2021. At that time the Department will assess the grantee's feasibility of presenting public programs in traditional venues and performing spaces; if necessary, the Department is prepared to exercise appropriate contractual flexibility to include virtual programs and other program delivery strategies, as may be necessary.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 31 grants from the FY 2020-2021 Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2021-2022 Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Panel, chaired by Cultural Affairs Council member Mitchell Bierman, convened on Tuesday, May 18, 2021 to review 33 applications requesting a total of \$2,500,000. The Panel recommended funding all 33 applications.

The objective of the Youth Arts Miami (YAM) Grants Program is to provide operational funding support to non-profit youth arts organizations having a year-round presence in Miami-Dade County whose primary mission is to create, present or exhibit cultural programs for children and/or with children. Applicants to this program must have at least a 3-year track record of providing a year-round season of youth arts activities for children and youth. Programs must include public access components such as performances or exhibitions. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

The YAM program is structured into three funding categories: <u>Category A</u> funds large-sized professional youth arts organizations invited to apply by Department of Cultural Affairs staff and possessing the potential to achieve regional, national or international visibility as evidenced by the organization's current programs and structure. <u>Category B</u> funds mid-sized semi-professional and professional youth arts organizations demonstrating a total prior year's organizational revenues of between \$200,000 and \$500,000. <u>Category C</u> funds small and/or developing youth arts organizations with annual organizational revenues between \$50,000 and \$200,000.

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact - efforts to fulfill the youth arts mission of the organization; 2) artistic merit; 3) management, organizational development and financial capability; and 4) reach (ability to reach underserved children and youth who may be limited by geography, economics or disability and impact on and involvement of Miami-Dade's multicultural community). Attached is a list describing the organizations and programs recommended for funding.

Grant #1 : All Florida Youth Orchestra, Inc. 1708 N 40 AVE Hollywood, Florida 33021

Funds are requested to support music education and outreach performances for 2,000 students ages 5-18, at various community sites and public venues in Miami Dade County. Program activities will include orchestral training, violin and percussion instruction for at-risk youth, Family Concerts, and outreach performances. Participants will engage in music education and benefit from improved musical skills and social / behavioral skills.

<u>Grant #2 : Alliance for Musical Arts Productions, Inc.</u> 5020 NW 197 ST Miami Gardens, Florida 33055

Funds are requested to support Musical Arts Theater & Tutoring-MATT Program for 30 students ages 7-18 in a virtual setting due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, until further notice. Program activities will include sessions in musical sight-reading, percussion, and composition. Participants will engage in music/percussion training, and benefit from mastering the skills taught and the confidence of a lesson learned.

Grant #3 : American Children's Orchestras for Peace, Inc. 2150 Coral Way #3-C Miami, Florida 33145

Funds are requested to support American Children's Orchestras for Peace for 2,300 students ages 5-18 at Jose Marti Park, Shenandoah Elementary and Shenandoah Park in Miami. Program activities include music history, playing instruments, and reading/writing musical notation. Participants will engage in instruction in classical music, Latin/Afro-Caribbean, recorder, chorus, piano, and Zumba and benefit from literature, fitness, social-emotional, and life skills.

Grant #4 : Area Performance Gallery, Inc. dba Area Stage Company 5701 Sunset Drive Suite 286 South Miami, Florida 33143

Funds are requested to support Area Stage Company's conservatory for 1,000 students ages 5-22 at Area Stage Company in South Miami. Program activities include a structured curriculum of group classes and private instruction and a full season of large-scale theatre productions. Participants will engage in theatre-based learning, encompassing acting, singing, dancing, and stage tech, benefiting from expanded and strengthened leadership skills, emotional intelligence, goal setting, and self-assurance.

Grant #5 : Armour Dance Theater, Inc 5818 SW 73 ST Miami, Florida 33143

Funds are requested to support Armour Dance Theater programming for 850 students ages 5-18 at five sites in South Miami, Little Haiti, West Coconut Grove, Miami Gardens, and West Perrine. Program activities will include instruction in ballet, tap, modern, hip hop, West African, and Bollywood. Participants will engage in dance, reading, and homework (math) assistance, and art classes. Skills learned include discipline, consistency, focus, delayed gratification and improved reading skills.

Grant #6 : Art Creates US Inc. dba ProjectArt

Funds are requested to support ProjectArt Miami for 240 students ages 4-18 at multiple Miami-Dade Public Libraries. Program activities will include tuition-free art classes, nine-month professional residencies for emerging artists, and the presentation of two final exhibitions. Participants will engage with a variety of art materials in both 2D, 3D and digital projects, and benefit from increased literacy, self-esteem and problem-solving skills.

Grant #7 : Ballet Etudes of South Florida, Inc. 6812 NW 169th Street Hialeah, Florida 33015

Funds are requested to support Ballet Etudes for 250 students ages 3-18, and 10 dancers ages 18-22 at Ballet Etudes studio, Lou Rawls Center for the Performing Arts, City of Hialeah, Lehman Theater and more in Hialeah, Miami Lakes, and Miami Gardens. Program activities will include performances and dance training. Participants will engage in dance, especially classical ballet and benefit from discipline, focus, teamwork, performing, musicality, and physical conditioning.

Grant #8 : Bilingual School of Business & Performing Arts Inc. 8933 NW 178 ST Hialeah, Florida 33018

Funds are requested to support after-school performing arts programs for 150 students ages 3-18 at the BBharts Performing Arts Academy in Hialeah. Program activities will include performing arts classes and workshops, competitions, performances, and community events. Participants will engage in dance, acting, and music, and benefit from increased artistic ability and value-driven personal growth.

Grant #9 : Diva Arts & Entertainment, Inc.

Funds are requested to support Diva Arts' Dance Empowers Youth Program for 120 students ages 5-19 at Diva Arts Dance Studio in Miami Gardens. Program activities will include dance training (e.g., ballet, contemporary, jazz, hip-hop), personal development, community outreach and choreography. Students will master skills in dance technique, improve academically, display a positive sense of self, and increase knowledge in health awareness.

Grant #10 : enFAMILIA, Inc. PO BOX 924229 Homestead, Florida 33092

Grant funds will be used to support a year-round arts program for 300 students ages 8-15 at enFAMILIA, in Homestead and Florida City. Activities include multidisciplinary art classes, exhibits, and performances where students engage in dance, music, drama, creative writing, film production, and visual arts. Students will benefit from learning various art skills, as well as the causes, consequences, and solutions to substance abuse and at-risk behaviors.

Project activities will include singing, playing instruments, and movement. Participants will engage in music education and benefit from age-appropriate activities stimulating learning and enjoyment while enhancing brain development.
