MIAMI-DADE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS WINS NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR ITS "GOING TO THE MUSEUM" GUIDE

(Miami – August 28, 2014) The Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs has won a 2014 National Association of Counties (NACo) Achievement Award which recognizes innovative county government programs that modernize government and increase services to county residents. The Department was honored for its <u>"Going to the Museum"</u> guide for new audiences: a free tri-lingual online resource, printed guide and classroom poster designed to help prepare new visitors for a museum experience.

The Department of Cultural Affairs created <u>"Going to the Museum"</u> as a companion to its award winning <u>"Going to the Show"</u> guide. The guides were created using the principles of <u>Universal Design</u> and keeping children with Sensory Processing and Autism Spectrum Disorders in mind, but can also be used as an effective tool to teach all children museum etiquette and help prepare them for what to expect when visiting a museum.

Depicted in comic book style with easy-to-understand language and accompanied by delightful "anime-like" illustrations of friendly animals, <u>"Going to the Museum"</u> explains what to expect when visiting a museum such as an art, history, science or children's museum. The story highlights key events and situations that visitors are likely to encounter along the way, such as unfamiliar people, waiting in line, darkened spaces, and unexpected or sometimes loud sounds. The guide also includes an introduction with brief instructions on how readers can personalize the story with additional dialogue and descriptions in order to create their own version of <u>"Going to the Museum."</u>

Parents, educators and organizations working with children can view <u>"Going to</u> <u>the Museum"</u> online and request free printed copies or classroom posters by visiting the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs <u>"Going to the Museum"</u> webpage at <u>www.miamidadearts.org/education/going-museum</u>. The guide is available in English, Spanish and Creole.

<u>"Going to the Museum"</u> was developed by the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs as part of its <u>"All Kids Included - Accessible Arts Experiences for Kids"</u> (AKI) program. AKI creates inclusive arts and cultural programs so that kids of all abilities and their families can participate fully in the arts. AKI is an initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs, made possible with the support of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and the Cultural Affairs Council, the Miami-Dade County Mayor and Board of County Commissioners, and in part through grant funding provided by The Children's Trust. The Children's Trust is a dedicated source of revenue established by voter referendum to improve the lives of children and families in Miami-Dade County by making strategic investments in their future.
